Commentary for August 10, 2008 – Two Temple and Tomb Presentations

Early on two evenings, August 12 and August 14, I will give combined Temple/Tomb presentations at two suburban area libraries in the Phoenix, Arizona vicinity. At each venue I will present a 2-part combined presentation of both the Temple and Tomb information.

Part 1 of the lecture will show Dr. Ernest L. Martin's Temple information, that the proper location of the Jewish Temples in Jerusalem was above and west of the Gihon Springs. The proper location was south of the false "Temple Mount" (the Haram esh-Sharif), which is the present site of the golden Dome of the Rock and the al-Aqsa Mosque.

Part 2 of the lecture will show the location and future discovery of the Tombs of the Jewish Kings David and Solomon. These Tombs are in close proximity to the correct Temple location. Dr. Martin's Temple research gives vital clues to the location of the Tombs at Jerusalem. Historical and biblical sources indicate clearly that the bodies of King David, Solomon, and possibly others are in the Tombs. It is believed that the Tombs are intact and will yield more important information and documents than any ancient tomb, including the Tomb of King Tutankhamen.

Both locations are easily accessible from anywhere in the Phoenix area. Below are maps of the two locations.

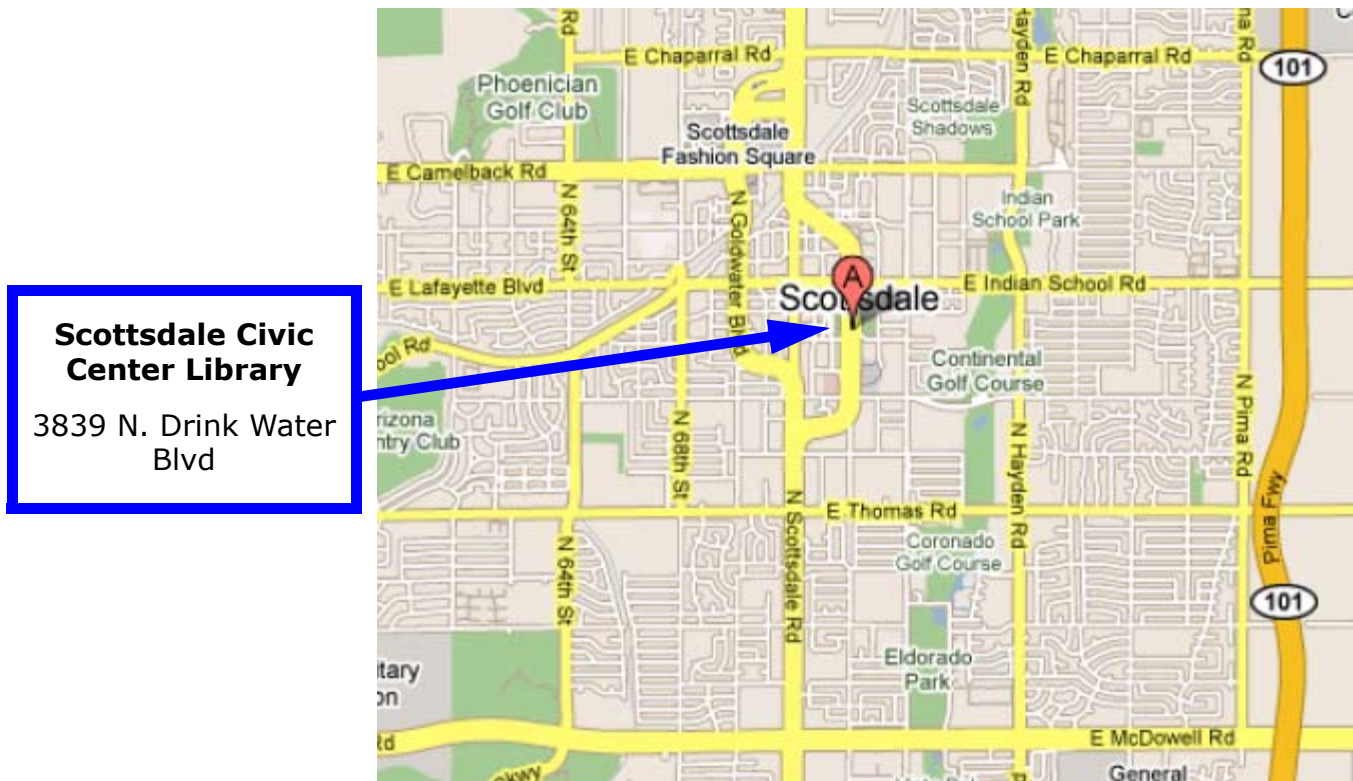
City of Mesa Main Library
