This is a short Commentary to let everyone know about the **four (4) speaking engagements** in Southern California during the month of November 2007. Two I have mentioned before and two are new.

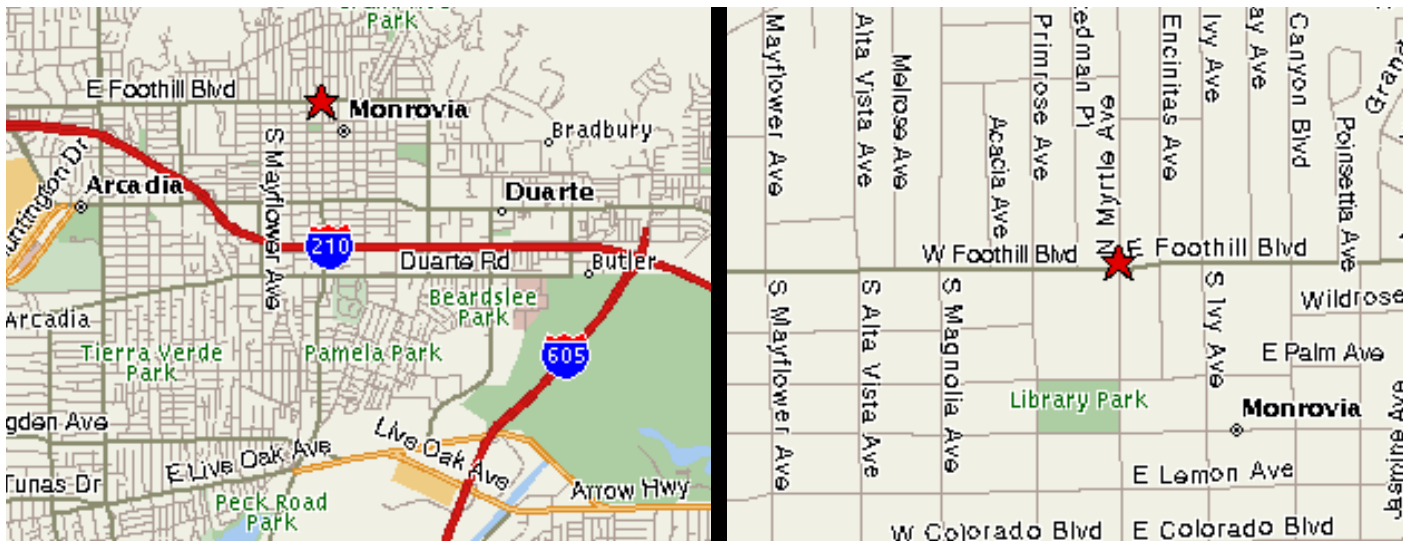
Feel free to invite friends and relatives to attend these presentations. I hope to meet several of you at the presentations.

Maps below are for the First Presbyterian Church in Monrovia:

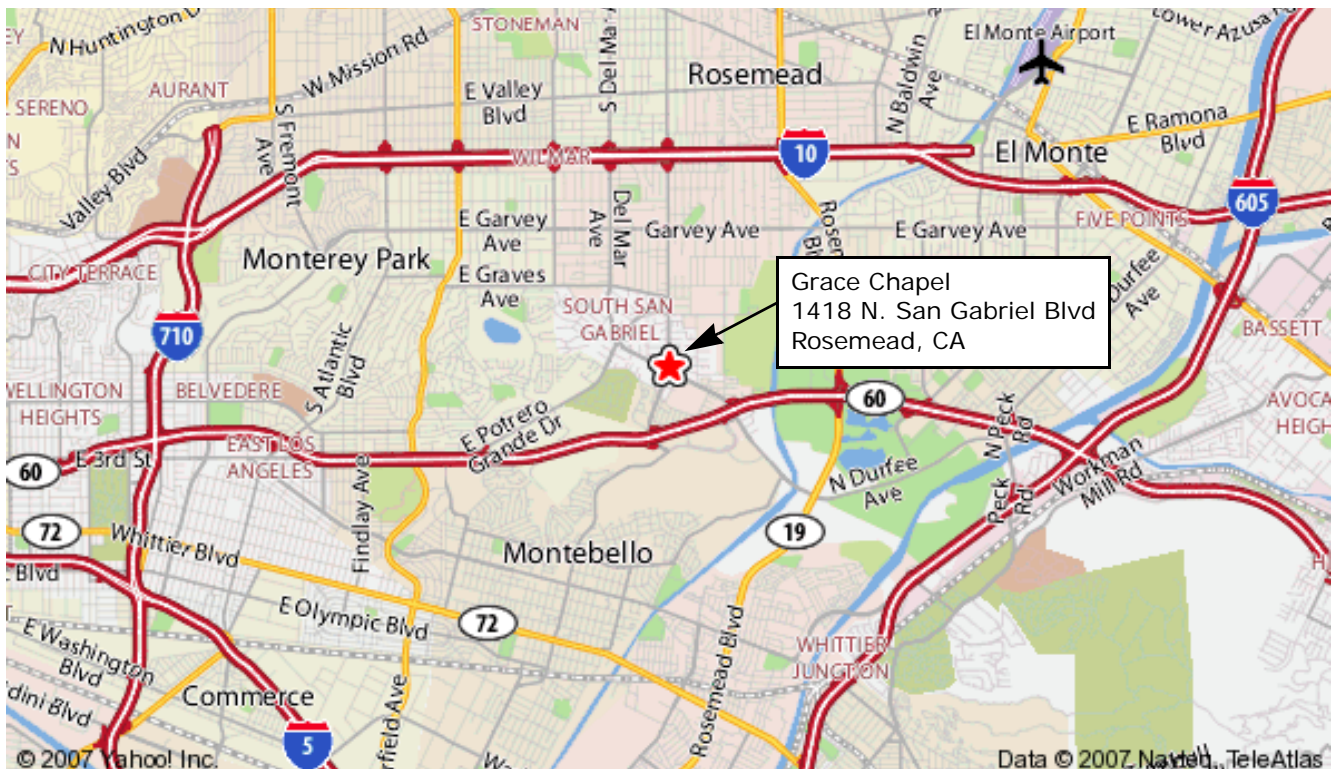


2. Saturday, **November 10, 2007, 2:00 p.m.** — **FREE** — Open to the public. This presentation will be given to members of various organizations.
