The May 2023 article is "Christ and Messiah." As you read this article remember that the Hebrew word "Messiah" has the same meaning as the Greek word "Christ." The meaning of "Christ" has been diminished because of our familiarity with the term. It is used casually by Christians everywhere, and there is nothing wrong with using it so. Therefore, "Christ" and "Messiah" are equivalent terms and represent the same concept. Both are derived from the general idea that a "Messiah" or the "Christ" is an individual who has received an anointing, usually with olive oil.

When "Christ" and "Messiah" are used to describe what Jesus has done and is doing for you, me, all humanity, and all intelligent created beings, the meaning of those synonymous titles is expanded. "Christ" is **not** the surname, the last name, of Jesus. "Christ" and "Messiah" are titles for one concept. Did you know the word "Christ" occurs 530 times in the New Testament? When such words are used so many times it indicates the importance of what the word signifies and what it conveys.

Do not ignore biblical words that are used so often. The hundreds of uses of "Christ" makes us think it is a common word, but it has uncommon and extraordinary meaning. And yes, "Christ" in the New Testament is totally associated with Jesus. Remember its importance whenever you read it. It will build your faith.

True, faith does not <u>require</u> evidence (it is a gift of God), but it is comforting to know that after you believe, the evidence of our faith <u>is found</u> in God's Word. That is why God's Scriptures were given to us:

"Now all these things

- [1] happened unto them [Israel] for examples: and
- [2] they are written for our admonition,

upon whom the ends of the world [eons] are come."

• 1 Corinthians 10:11

The Scriptures are for our encouragement and for us to study. So ... what do YOU believe? Can you prove your beliefs from Scripture? I hope this article will deepen your understanding of the terms "Christ" and "Messiah," and you will be able to explain their importance to others when opportunities arise. The Gospel of Messiah is more profound than simply saying words like "Jesus saved me." The full nature of the process of our salvation is fully explained in the Scriptures. Enjoy the article.

Communicating Information: From the Mouths Of Few To The Ears Of Many

In ancient times, most information was delivered orally, from a person's voice to the ears of the listeners. This is why in ancient Greece and Rome, the ability to use rhetoric was very important. See the webpage, "What Is Rhetoric, and Why Is It Important?" They give an operational definition of what rhetoric is and why it is useful.

In fact, the Holy Scriptures have a unique capability to communicate with people. The apostle Paul correctly wrote, "faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God" (Romans 10:17). The good words of Scripture will strengthen your faith, and lead you to more study, and to recognize the truths of Scripture. All the teachings of Jesus were spoken by Him (the Living Word of God) to people.

In ancient times, voices reached more minds from speakers to listeners than any copied book could reach when read alone. Books, written on clay tablets and later scrolls, were written by hand and slow to produce. Books were read at small gatherings limited by hearing distance and the strength of the speaker's voice.

This is why listening to the Scriptures read aloud is a wonderful way to learn while relaxing, or doing chores, whether you listen to Psalms, historical books, prophetic books, or the Old Testament writings, or the New Testament Gospels, epistles, or Revelations. Each writing in Scripture has a unique way to convey the quick, powerful, and sharp Word of God (Hebrews 4:12). Remember also the words of the Psalmist: "How precious also are your thoughts unto me, O God! how great is the sum of them!" (Psalm 139:17).
