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This month's article is "[King David's Tomb 4. Its Location.](#)" It is the last in the four-part series of articles. I expanded the information about where the Tombs of David are located. The first two articles ("[King David's Tomb 1. What Is Inside?](#)" and "[King David's Tomb 2. Best Discoveries](#)") list the many artifacts that should be in the Tombs of David, along with the bodies. The third article ("[King David's Tomb 3. House of David](#)") provides clues how the phrase "**house of David**" helps locate the complex of Tombs. Surprising biblical evidence and historical references refer to "**the house of David**" as a physical location with an opening. In those instances, the phrase does not refer to David's descendants.

With such clues and other evidence, I believe God will reveal the location of King David and the "good" Kings of Judah. However, no prophecies explicitly state the Tombs will be opened, but there are interesting verses such as Isaiah 22:22 about a key that will open "**the House of David**" that will never be closed. Isaiah 2:3 and Micah 4:2 say that the law will come forth "**OUT of Zion.**" The apostle Paul tells us that a "**deliverer**" also will come "**out of Zion**" (Romans 11:26). The resurrected Christ Jesus, David's greater Son, is that deliverer (Acts 13:22–23). Yet something connected with David sets the stage for Christ's return, and information about God will flow "**out of Zion.**" The Tombs of David are in Zion at the "**House of David.**"

This research began with Dr. Ernest Martin making discoveries that led him to conclude the Temples of Jerusalem were built above and west of the Gihon Springs. While that statement is still controversial, more evidence continues to be discovered by several researchers. Yet strong opposition remains, but more people are accepting that the traditional "temple mount" is actually the remains of Fort Antonia.

With more truth pouring out, such as discovery of the Tombs, Israel could begin rebuilding the Temple immediately with the blessing of Palestinians, Arabs, and Muslims around the world. Some foreign rulers might assist in its construction, as when King Hiram of Tyre sent artists to Solomon. Perhaps Iran will help?

The Tombs are in bedrock inside Mount Zion in the City of David in Jerusalem. They are underground within the first curve of Hezekiah's Tunnel where it turns from a west-flowing channel to the south. The information is supported by biblical and historical information from surprising sources. It seems that clues to the location of the Tombs of David are easier to follow than the evidence regarding the Jerusalem Temples themselves. This is due to the total destruction by the Romans who dismantled the Herodian Temple, stone by stone.
